DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES MEETING

Walnut Capital and Strada will be presenting to the Oakland community their plan for Parcel "A" of Oakland Crossings. The proposed 2.66-acre development, located at **3401 Boulevard of the Allies**, seeks to construct a multistory mixed-use building on the former Quality Inn site. Located at the intersection of Boulevard of the Allies, Halket Street, Zulema Street, and Coltart Avenue in Central Oakland, the proposed development calls for a grocery store, 426 apartment units, an integrated 438-space parking garage, and ground-floor retail uses (including a 33,000-square-foot grocery store and 8,000 square feet of additional retail space). The project will require review and approval by the City of Pittsburgh Planning Commission.

What is a Registered Community Organization?

Oakland Planning and Development Corporation (OPDC), the Oakland Business Improvement District (OBID), and Oakcliffe Community Organization (OCO) are the Registered Community Organizations (RCOs) serving the area of the Oakland neighborhood at and around the proposed development site. Being RCOs gives these organizations a formal role with the City of Pittsburgh in the review of development activities and the coordination of neighborhood planning processes, including Development Activities Meetings.

What is a Development Activities Meeting?

A Development Activities Meeting (DAM) provides an opportunity for citizens, property owners, business owners, and other stakeholders to learn about development proposals that affect them and to resolve concerns with proposed development teams during the development application process. DAMs must be held at least 30 days prior to an applicant's first public hearing at the Planning Commission, Zoning Board of Adjustment, Art Commission, or Historic Review Commission.
