- a. **Lawn/Ophelia Stormwater Project** - The project should start construction mid to late June and should be completed in the fall, most likely end of October. There are still issues with proposed street closures, parking, and traffic patterns. - b. **Residential Parking Permit Program Ordinance #2021-1867** was passed by City Council. Its implementation is unclear as more resources are needed for enforcement and administration. Changes include Dept of City Planning no longer being involved in making regulations and setting policy with unclear roles of Parking Authority and Dept of Mobility and Infrastructure to do so, developing hybrid districts, and new non-resident permit types for landlords, contractors, medical care workers, and childcare providers.
