During the month of September, staff and Steering Committee members attended a variety of events in Oakland to get input from the broader Oakland community on the draft strategies.”

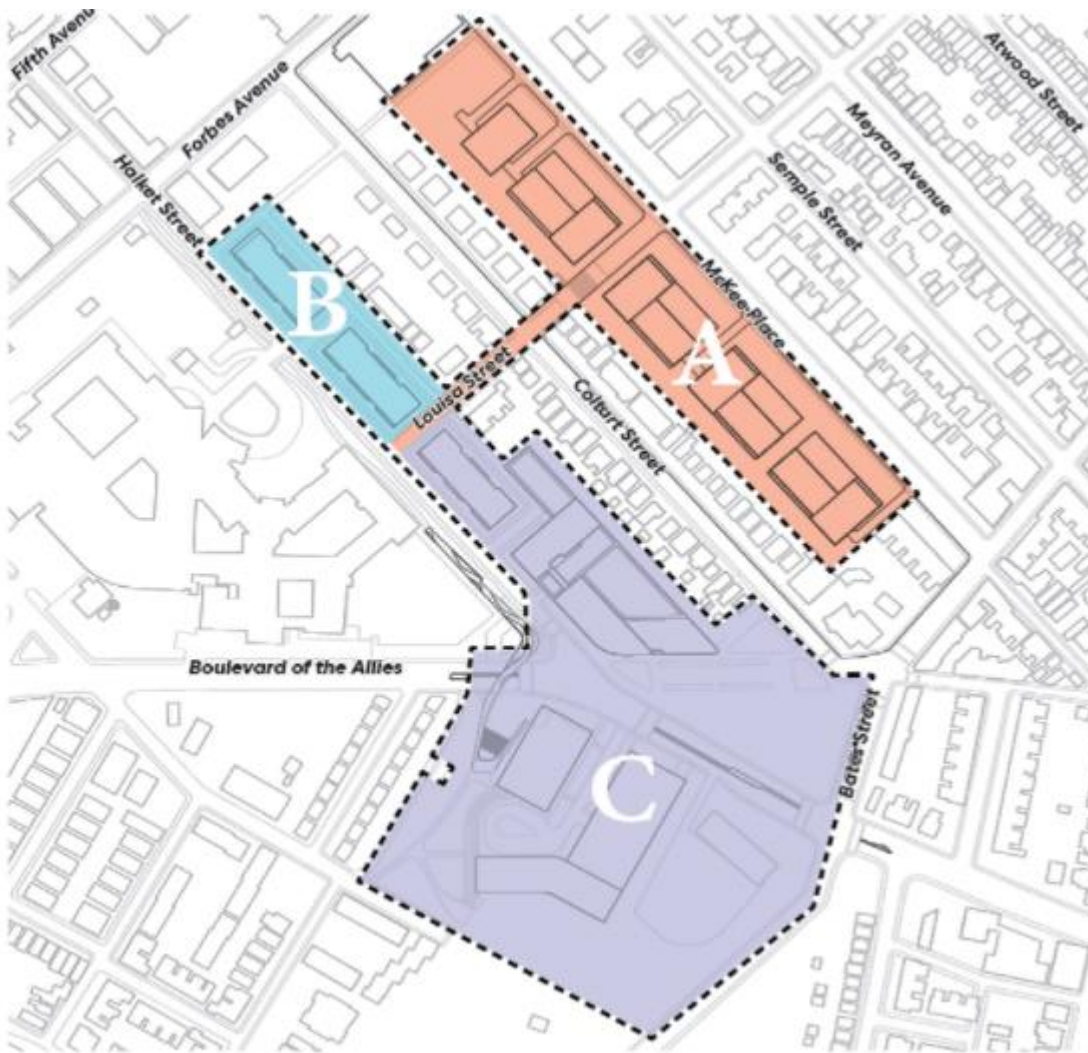
